Clinics will offer **first doses of Pfizer vaccine** to residents 12 years of age and older.

Booking an appointment in advance is preferred; however, there may be some capacity for walk-ins (last walk-in appointment at 6 p.m.), which will be accommodated on a first-come, first-served basis.
